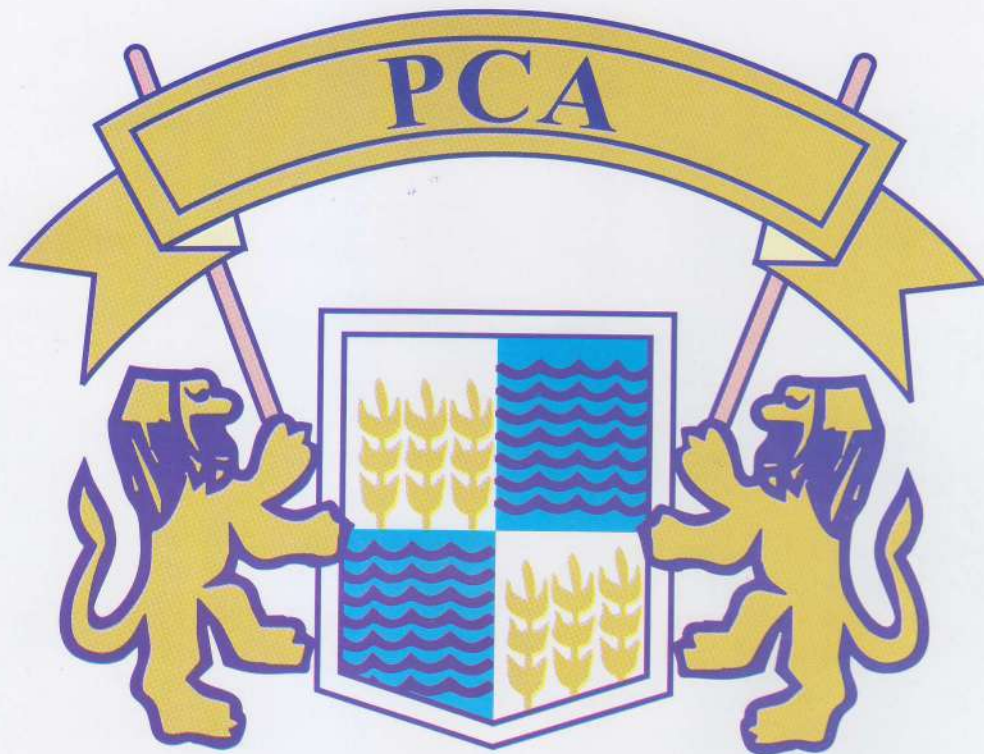

ANNUAL REPORT – 2016-2017

The Interim Committee is pleased to present the 68th Annual report of the Association. In the year there have been hectic activities regarding the structure of the State Associations. The Honorable Supreme Court in January 2017 had ordered the adoption of recommendations of the Lodha Committee regarding the structure of the BCCI and the State Associations, which would be affecting the PCA also. In order to run the activities of the Association till such time the total picture was to be cleared, a meeting of the Extra Ordinary General Body had been called and an Interim Committee formed to run the affairs of the association. There has been an active legal activity at the BCCI and State Associations level who have been presenting their point of view to the Hon'ble court.

The year under report has been very productive and exciting for the Association on and off the field. The association as usual organized matches at the senior and junior level through the inter district competition to ensure that the best talent of the state is available for selection of the state teams for taking part in the Inter State tournaments. There has been a lot of emphasis on fitness through various camps held at I.S. Bindra stadium PCA Mohali and Dhruv Pandove Cricket stadium Patiala before the beginning of the National season. The U-13-15 academies have been given special treatment for harnessing young talent for future state teams by appointing special designated coaches for these academies. A state wide hunt was also organized to find out young and tall persons to be drafted for building a nucleus of fast bowlers for Under-23 and Senior groups. These selected boys have been getting regular

coaching at the PCA Cricket academy Mohali. We hope the experiment will give good results. Our senior team playing in the Ranji trophy league elite group could not make it to the knock out stage. In the One day Vijay Hazare tournament the knock out stage could not to be reached. In the T-20 tournament for the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy we were no.3 in the group. Punjab's lone success at national level came in the U-23 Col.CK .Nayudu Trophy which they won at Dhruv Pandove stadium Patiala by defeating Andhra Pradesh.

In the U-19 trophy Punjab having reached the knock out stage could not go past Bengal in the quarter finals and in one day tournament of Vinoo Mankad trophy topped the league.

Punjab U-16 team could not retain their Vijay Merchant Trophy. After having won the north Zone league they lost to Hyderabad in the quarter finals at Sagar.

Our U-19 and senior woman team could not qualify for the super league while senior women team in T20 format also could not make the cut.

Nine Punjab players i.e. Harbhajan Singh, Yuvraj Singh, Mandeep Singh, Gurkirat Singh, Siddharth Kaul, Manan Vohra, Sandeep Sharma, Barinder Saran, Manpreet Gony represented various franchise team in IPL -10 (2017).

Yuvraj Singh was selected for the champions trophy played in England and also toured with the Indian team to West Indies. Mandeep Singh played against Newzeland in one day and T-20 against England. He also played for India-A in quadrangular series held in Australia. Abhishek Sharma and Shubman Gill were also selected to represent India U-19.

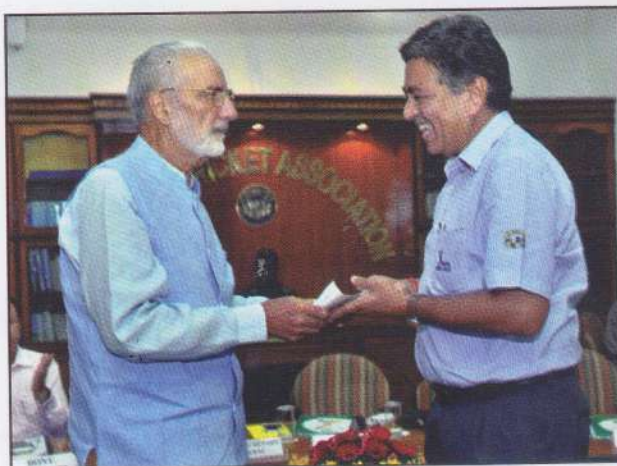


Mr. Jawahar Lal Bhargava veteran cricketer being honoured by Sh. M.P. Pandove.

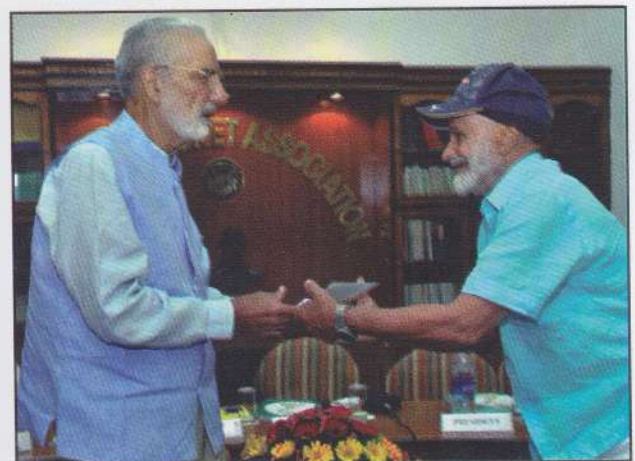


Sh. Vinod Sharma veteran cricketer receiving the silver plaque from Sh. M.P. Pandove.

India vs England 3rd Test Match 30 Nov 2016

PCA hosted the India-England 3rd Test Match from 26th November to 30th November, 2016 at I.S. Bindra Stadium, PCA Mohali. India registered a 8 wickets win against England in four days. England was led by Alastair Cook while Virat Kohli led the Indian side. England won the toss and elected to bat but were restricted to 283 in 93.5 overs. The England innings revolved around wicket keeper Johny Bairstow 89 off 177 balls with six boundaries, Jos Buttler 43 off 80 balls with five boundaries. Other notable contributions came

from Alastair Cook 27 off 42 balls with six boundaries, Ben Stokes 29 off 59 balls with five boundaries and Chris Woakes 25 off 70 balls with three boundaries. The bowling honours for India were shared by Right arm medium pacer Mohammed Shammi 5 for 63, Umesh Yadav 2 for 58, Jayant Yadav 2 for 49, R.Ashwin 1 for 43 and Ravindra Jadeja 2 for 59. Replying India were all out for 417 in 138.2 overs and took a lead of 134 runs on the first innings. Parthiv Patel 42, Cheteshwar Pujara 51, Virat Kohli 62, R.Ashwin 72,

Ravindra Jadeja 90 and Jayant Yadav 55 were the main run getters for India. For England Adil Rashid 4 for 118 and Ben Stokes 5 for 73 were the main wicket takers.

In their second Essay England were able to score 236 in 90.2 overs and set a target of 102 runs for India to win. Joe Root 78, Haseeb Hameed

59 not out and Chris Woakes 30 were the main run getters for England. Mohd. Shammi 2 for 37, R. Ashwin 3 for 81, Ravindra Jadeja 2 for 62 and Jayant Yadav 2 for 21 were the most successful bowlers for India. India chased down the target of 102 runs by scoring 104 runs for the loss of two wickets in 20.2 overs and won the match by 8

Tom Latham who was keeping one end up was next to go being caught by Hardik Pandya off KedarJadhav for 61 off 72 balls. Mitchel Sanitor 7 ,Tim Southee 13 got out early reducing Newzeland to 199 for 8 in 37.5 overs. Then a 84 runs

partnership for the 9th wicket between Jimmy Nisham 57 off 47 balls with 7 boundaries and Matt Henry unbeaten 39 off 37 balls with 4 boundaries and 1 six saw the Newzeland team reach 285 in 49.4 overs before being bowled out. The bowling honours for India were shared by Umesh Yadav 3 for 75, Jasprit Bumrah 2 for 52 , Kedar Jadhav 3 for 29 and Amit Mishra 2 for 46.

There after Virat Kohli in company of skipper MS DHoni started retrieving the position and the duo were involved in a 151 runs partnership for the third wicket which came in 27.1 overs. The partnership was broken when MS Dhoni was caught by Ross Taylor off Matt Henry for 80 off 91 balls with 6 boundaries and 3 sixes. Manish Pandey joined Virat Kohli and the two took India's total to 289 for 3 in 48.2 overs to record a comprehensive 7 wickets win. Virat Kohli went on to complete an unbeaten swashbuckling 154 off 133 balls studded with 16 well struck boundaries and 1 six while Manish Pandey remained unbeaten on 28 off 34 balls with 3 boundaries. For Newzeland the bowling honours were shared by Matt Henry 2 for 56 and Tim Southee 1 for 55. Virat Kohli for his brilliant unbeaten century was named man of the match.

Indian Premier League 2017

Four home matches of Kings XI Punjab were played at IS Bindra PCA Stadium Mohali. The first match between Kings XI Punjab VS Sunriser Hyderabad was the 33rd match of the competition and was

hustled out for 67 in 17.1 overs. Corry Anderson 18 being the highest run getter. For Kings XI Punjab Sandeep Sharma 4 for 20 , Varun Aaron 2 for 3 and Axar Patel 2 for 22 shared the spoils. Kings XI hit up 68 for no loss in 7.5 overs to record a 10 wicket win. Martin Guptill remaining unbeaten on 50 off 27 balls with 6 boundaries and 3 sixes and Hashim Amla unbeaten 16.

Inter State Senior days tournament for Ranji Trophy

Punjab were drawn in pool-A along with Railways, Mumbai, Gujarat, Tamilnadu, Uttarpradesh, Baroda, Bengal and Madhya Pradesh. The Ranji Trophy matches were played on neutral venues this season. Punjab started their Ranji Trophy campaign on 6th October 2016 by taking on Railways at Palam, New Delhi. Punjab conceded first innings lead to Railways who garnered 3 points while Punjab got 1. Winning the toss Punjab opted to field. Railways led by century by Shivkant Shukla (128) and Ashish Yadav 81 posted 331 in 118 overs. Siddharth Kaul 5 for 68 was the pick of Punjab bowlers. Punjab replied with 251 in 80.1 overs. Uday Kaul 61, Gurkirat Mann 66 being the main run getters. M.R Choudhary 4 for 66 was the most successful bowler for Railways. Railways declared their 2nd innings at 245 for 7 in 81.2 overs. Shivkant Shukla 97, Saurab Waksakar 57 and Mahesh Rawat 48 being the main contributors with the bat. Vinay Choudhary 3 for 63 was the most successful bowler for Punjab. Punjab in their 2nd innings were 173 for 3 in 58 overs when the match ended. Uday Kaul unbeaten 61 and Mandeep Singh unbeaten 41.

Punjab traveled to Lahli to take on MPCA from 13-16 Oct 2016. Punjab won the match by 126 runs and garnered 6 points. Put into bat by MP Punjab rattled up 378 in 108.2 overs before being bowled out. Punjab innings prospered on 2nd wicket partnership of 180 runs between Jeewanjot Singh and Yuvraj Singh and 4th wicket partnership of 156 runs between Yuvraj Singh and Gurkirat Mann. Yuvraj Singh plundered 177 runs inclusive of 24 boundaries while Gurkirat Mann scored 103

with the help of 16 boundaries and 1 six. Jeewanjot contributed 61. For MP Ishwar Pande took 8 wickets for 102. Replaying MP were bowled out for 247 in 87 overs with Shubam Sharma 53 being the highest run getter. Manpreet Garewal 6 for 36 was the most successful bowler for Punjab. Punjab declared their 2nd innings at 175 for 9 in 51.3 overs with Yuvraj Singh contributing 76, while Ishwar Pandey was the most successful bowler for MP with figures of 3 for 25. MPCA in their 2nd innings were bowled out for 180 in 64.4 overs. Shubam Sharma with 37 being the highest run getter. Manpreet Garewal 4 for 41 and Siddharth Kaul 3 for 42 engineered the collapse.

The third match of the tournament was played at Bilaspur (HP) against Bengal from 20-23 Oct 2016. Punjab lost the plot as they crashed to 115 runs defeat. Punjab failed to garner any point while Bengal garnered 6 points. Winning the toss and opting to field the Punjab bowlers could not contain the Bengal batsman who went on to raise 404 in 120.3 overs before being bowled out. The Bengal charge was led by Sham Shekar Mandal 135, Agniv Pan 70, Suddep Chatterjee 51 and Pankaj Shaw 55. For Punjab Sandeep Sharma 4 for 96 and Vinay Choudhary 3 for 75 were the main wicket takers. Replaying Punjab were bowled out for 271 in 81.3 overs. Uday Kaul 77, Sandeep Sharma unbeaten 46 and Geetansh Khera 38 were the main contributors. Medium Pacer Ashok Dinda 5 for 58 and AMit Kulia 5 for 76 sharing the spoils. Bengal in their 2nd innings were restricted to 226 in 64.5 overs with Manoj Tiwari 92 being the highest run getter. For Punjab Siddharth Kaul 6 for 57 was



the main wicket taker. Punjab in their 2nd knock capitulated for 244 in 72.3 overs. Manan Vohra 75 and Jeewanjot 44 putting on 100 runs for the first wicket. MANpreet Singh Garwal played a brief cameo of 43 studded with 5 boundaries and 3 sixes. Pragyan Ojha 4 for 70 and Amit Kulia 3 for 93 were the most successful bowlers for Bengal.

Punjab's next encounter against Baroda at Ferozshah Kotla, Delhi was played from 27-30 Oct 2016. In a high scoring match Punjab got 1st innings lead and secured 3 points while Baroda got 1. Winning the toss and opting to bat Baroda rattled up 529 in 140 overs. They were helped in their cause by a brilliant unbeaten century by Deepak Hooda 293 which included 25 boundaries and 6 sixes. D.M Mistry 76, PR Shah 42, Swapnil K Singh 45 being the other contributors. Sandeep Sharma 4 for 101 was the most successful bowler for Punjab. Punjab in reply scored 670 in 184 overs before being bowled out. Punjab batsmen were in full flow as their opener Manan Vohra 224 off 386 balls with 20 boundaries and 2 sixes and skipper Yuvraj Singh 260 off 370 balls with 26 boundaries and 4 sixes hammered the Baroda attack. The duo were involved in 343 runs stand for the third wicket. Gurkirat Mann 55, Uday Kaul 42 were the other contributors with the bat. Swapnil Singh 4 for 169 and Vishnu Solanki 3 for 51 shared the spoils for Baroda.

Punjab then moved to Hyderabad to take on UP from 5-8 Nov 2016. Punjab won by 7 wickets to garner 6 points. UP won the toss and opted to bat and scored 335 in 102.5 overs. Umang Sharma 49, Rinku Singh 50, Eklavya Diwedi 60, Kuldeep Yadav 71 and Saurabh Kumar 52 being the main contributors. For Punjab Sandeep Sharma 5 for 85

and Subek Gill 3 for 57 shared the spoils. Punjab replied with 319 in 105.4 overs. 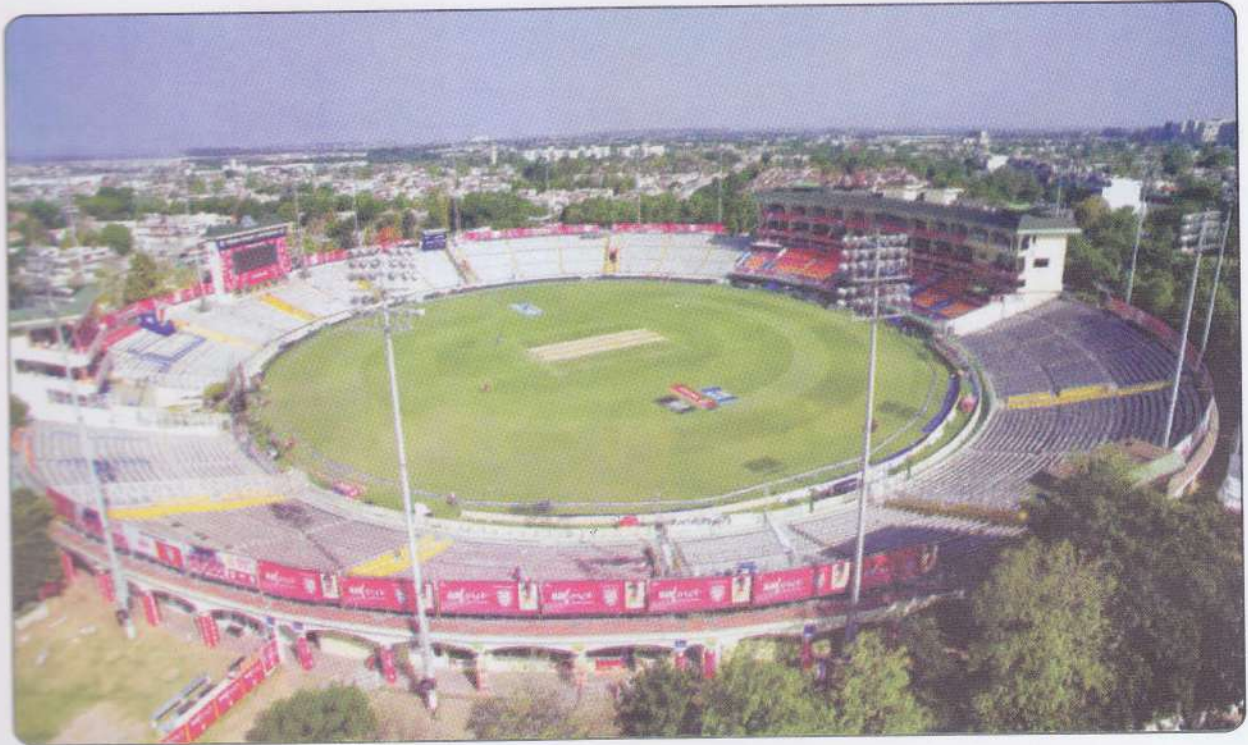



Significant Accounting Policies and Notes on accounts for the year ended 31- 03- 2017

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Background

The Punjab Cricket Association (The Association) has been registered as a Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 with the primary objective to promote, develop, control and regulate the game of Cricket in the State of Punjab and is affiliated to the Board of Control for Cricket in India.

b) Accounting Convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention, following the accrual concept of accounting in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India.

On the basis of the objectives of the Association as indicated in (a) above, the Association is a Small and Medium Sized Entity (SME) as defined by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI). Accordingly, the Accounting Standards issued by the ICAI and which are applicable to a Small and Medium Sized Entity, have been considered for the preparation of these accounts.

c) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires the Office Bearers to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) as of the date of the financial statements and the reported income and expenses during the reporting period. The Office Bearers believe that the estimates used in the preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable.

d) Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are valued at Cost.

e) Depreciation on all assets have been provided on WDV method at the rates specified in the Income Tax Rules, 1962. Assets used for a period of less than 180 days during the year are depreciated at 50% of the applicable rates as per the Income Tax Rules, 1962, in the year of acquisition and disposal.

Depreciation is accelerated on fixed assets, based on their condition, usability etc., as per the estimates of the Association, where necessary.

f) Income is recognized on accrual basis except for TV Rights and IPL Subvention from BCCI are being recognized at the time of actual receipt as the same is not ascertainable as at the close of the year by Punjab Cricket association. The accounting policies have been consistently applied during the year.

g) Impairment of Assets

The carrying amount of relevant assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine



whether there is any indication of impairment. If any indication exists, an assets's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of the asset exceeds the recoverable amount.

h) Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions are recognised only when there is a present or legal obligation as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefit will be required to settle the transaction and a reliable estimate can be made for the amount of the obligation. Contingent liability is disclosed for (i) Possible obligations which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the entity or (ii) Present obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made. Contingent assets are not recognised in the financial statements since this may result in the recognition of income that may never be realised.

2. Notes on Accounts:

- a) The Association is entitled for Infrastructure subsidy from BCCI against capital expenditure incurred for Expansion of Stadium and creation of additional facilities and new infrastructure. The same is being accounted for as and when received.
- b) Some of the balances appearing under sundry debtors, sundry creditors and loans and advances are subject to confirmation from respective parties.
- c) The Association has not made any provision of liability, if any, in respect of recovery suit/claim filed by some contractors. The same shall be accounted for at the time of final decision by the court and or appropriate authorities.
- d) Expenses reimbursed to Staff / Executive Members have been incurred for the official purpose of Punjab Cricket Association and no element of personal expenses have been charged to Income and Expenditure account. Further the association had not utilized any assets for the personal benefit of the office bearers.
- e) The Association remitted lease money amounting to Rs. 1356 for each year for the years 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 respectively in respect of land of PCA Cricket stadium, Mohali to the Director of Sports, Punjab vide Demand Draft. The same has been returned to the association since the court cases are pending in the Hon'ble Court. The Association expects a favourable decision with regards to the disputes and believes that no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.
- f) During the current financial year, the Association has received a total amount of Rs. 51,75,00,000/- from BCCI. As per the confirmation received from BCCI, an amount of Rs. 25,27,98,354/- is due towards Share of Media Rights and Franchisee Consideration for the accounting year 2015-16.

In addition an amount Rs. 8,66,89,642/- as balance share of Media Rights, Franchisee Consideration and hosting of matches for the accounting year 2014-15 has been received from BCCI during the year. Accordingly, an amount of Rs. 33,94,87,996/- is treated as Income of the Association during the financial year 2016-17 under following heads-:



- Share of Media Rights (2015-16)	- Rs. 15,55,13,662/-
- Share of Franchisee Consideration-IPL 2016	- Rs. 7,22,84,692/-
- Share for Test staging	- Rs. 2,50,00,000/-
- Balance Share of Media Rights and Franchisee Consideration (2014-15)	- Rs. 8,66,89,642/-

As confirmed by BCCI, the balance amount of Rs.26,47,01,646/- has been treated as Advance received from BCCI under Current Liabilities.

- g)** The Land of 19 Kanal and 11 Marla i.e. 2.44375 Acres at New Mullanpur has been compulsory acquired by GMADA for the construction of Master Plan Roads. As per their letter dated 28th February 2017, the total compensation awarded to PCA is Rs.153.40 Lacs.

In addition, GMADA has claimed an amount of Rs.375.66 Lacs as External Development (EDC) Charges and an amount of Rs.227.28 Lacs as PR-4 Road Cess charges.

The Association has contested the above compensation awarded and the above charges levied (EDC and PR-4 Cess)

Accordingly considering the grounds of uncertainty in determination of various amounts, no accounting entries have been made in the books of accounts for the above transactions. Consequential adjustments shall be made on final settlement of the matter.

h) Income Tax Status:

- i)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2001-02 to 2007-08(Asstt Year 2002-03 to 2008-09) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 16,78,52,435. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal), which was decided in its favour. The Department had gone on appeal against the order of the CIT (A) before the ITAT. The ITAT during the current financial year, has passed an order and has remanded back the matter to CIT(Appeals) for re examine in light of the provisions under Section 11(4A) of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- ii)** The Commissioner of Income Tax-II, passed order dated 31-03-09 for the cancellation of registration u/s 12-A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 granted to Punjab Cricket Association from assessment year 2009-10 onwards in view of amended provisions of Section 2(15) of the Income Tax Act. The Association had filed an appeal in the Appellant Tribunal, Chandigarh against the aforesaid order. The Appellate Tribunal vide its order dated 27-08-09 has set aside the above said order. In view of the ITAT order, Commissioner of Income Tax-II, restored registration u/s 12A of the Income Tax Act, 1961. The Department has filed an appeal before the High Court of Punjab and Haryana against the order of the ITAT, which is pending.
- iii)** The Commissioner of Income Tax-II, passed order dated 21-06-2012 for the cancellation of registration u/s 12-A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 granted to Punjab Cricket Association from assessment year 2009-10 onwards in view of amended provisions of Section 2(15) and section 12 AA(3) of the Income Tax Act. The Association filed an appeal against the



aforesaid order before Income Tax Appellate Tribunal. The Income Tax Appellate Tribunal passed order on 19th October 2015 in favour of PCA and restoring the exemption of PCA u/s 12A of the Income Tax Act. The Department has filed an appeal before the High Court of Punjab and Haryana against the order of the ITAT, which is pending.

- iv)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2008-09 (assessment Year 2009-10) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 11,52,62,650/-. The amount demanded Rs. 2,72,05,104/-, after adjustment of TDS and amount refundable Rs. 8,80,57,546/- in respect of other years, has been deposited by the association under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.
- v)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2009-10 (assessment Year 2010-11) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 12,28,61,350/- which has been deposited by the association under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT (Appeals). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT (Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.
- vi)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2010-11 (Assessment Year 2011-12) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 22,19,80,520/- which has been deposited by the association under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.
- vii)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial year 2011-12 (Assessment Year 2012-13) by treating that association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 11,78,97,820/-. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs.5,89,48,914/- under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending. The Association during the current year i.e. financial year 2016-17 has further deposited an amount of Rs.2,23,00,000/- under protest making a total payment of Rs.8,12,48,914/- against the total demand.



- viii)** The Income Tax department has made assessment for the financial year 2012-13 (Assessment Year 2013-14) by treating that association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs.12,61,25,080/-. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs.8,20,00,000/- under protest against the above order. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.
- ix)** The Income Tax department has made assessment for the financial year 2013-14 (Assessment Year 2014-15) by treating that association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs.2,94,45,710/-, after adjustment of TDS and Advance Tax of Rs.12.45 Crores deposited. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs.1,92,00,000/- under protest against the above order. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal) which is pending. The Association expects a favourable decision with respect to the income tax disputes based on professional advice and, hence, believes that no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.
- i)** The Punjab Cricket Association has received show cause notice from Directorate General of Central Excise Intelligence (DGCEI) dated 04.10.2013 for service tax amounting to Rs. 13,04,38,309/- from financial year 2008-09 to 2011-12. The nature of demand and break up of amount demanded are summarized below:-
- 1)** An amount of Rs. 63,16,201/- towards service tax on amount received from BCCI as "Reimbursement/ Tournament Subsidy" by categorizing the receipts under Event Management Services.
 - 2)** An amount of Rs. 12,41,22,108/- towards service tax on amount received from BCCI as "TV & IPL Subvention" by categorizing the receipts under Business Support Services.
- Based on a professional advice, PCA believes that it has a good cause and accordingly has replied to the above show cause notice on 25.03.2014 contesting and challenging the claim of service tax department.
- Accordingly PCA believes that no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.
- j)** PCA has received orders from Commissioner (Appeals), Service Tax regarding taxability on amount received on Associate Membership fee, sponsorship for interschool tournaments, share of catering received from caterer and held orders in favour of the department. PCA has further filed appeal with CESTAT, based on professional advice and deposited full Service Tax amounting to Rs. 10,23,645/- under protest. The same has been shown under the head "Service Tax deposit under protest" in Current Assets, Loans and Advances. PCA believes that no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.
- k)** During the Financial Year 2015-16, PCA has received orders from Assistant Commissioner, Service Tax regarding levy of Service Tax on share of catering under "Business Support Service"



and confirm the taxability. As advised by Tax Consultant, PCA has deposited an amount of Rs.26,000 being 7.5% of the Service Tax under protest and filed an appeal with Commissioner (Appeals). The case is still pending.

I) OTHER CLAIMS AGAINST THE ASSOCIATION NOT ACKNOWLEDGED AS DEBTS

- i. The Police Department, Punjab and Chandigarh is raising claims for deploying Police during matches, which as on 31-03-2017 amounted to Rs. 40.09 Crores. The same is being contested by the Association. The Association is of the view that the aforesaid claim is not payable in terms of Police Rules.
- ii. The Association has received claims from other government departments and other parties for an amount of Rs. 11.92 Lacs (to the extent quantifiable) as on 31st March, 2017. The amounts shown above represents the best possible estimates arrived at on the basis of the available information.

In the opinion of the Association, the above claims against the Association are not sustainable and hence, no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.

m) PREVIOUS YEAR FIGURES

Previous year's figures have been regrouped / reclassified wherever necessary, to conform to the current year's classification.
