ANNUAL REPORT – 2017-2018

We have the pleasure and privilege of presenting the 69th Annual report of the association duly approved by the executive committee. The interim committee was replaced after the elections to the state Association based on the Lodha Committee recommendations during the Annual General Meeting held on 24th September, 2017.

The year under report has been very productive and exciting for the Association on and off the field. The Association organized matches at the senior and junior level for age groups through the inter district competitions so that the best talent of the state is available for selection in the various age group state teams for taking part in the interstate national tournaments. There has been a lot of emphasis on fitness through various camps held at IS Bindra Stadium PCA Mohali and Dhruv Pandove Stadium Patiala before the start of the national domestic season. Our senior team playing in the elite group could not make it to the knock out stage. In the one day Vijay Hazare tournament knock out stage could not be reached. In the T-20 tournament for the Syed Mushtaq Ali trophy we qualified for the super league and were placed third in the group. In the under 23 Col CK Nayudu trophy we reached the semi-final but we won the U-23 one day tournament. In the under U-19 trophy Punjab reached the knock out stage but lost in the quarter

finals.

The Punjab U-16 team won the Vijay Merchant trophy by defeating Uttar Pradesh in the finals. Earlier they had topped the North Zone league. Our U-19, U-23, and senior women team could not qualify for the super league. The Punjab U-14 team one the North Zone Inter State tournament for Dhruv Pandove Trophy.

12 Punjab players represented various franchisees team in IPL (11) namely Harbhajan Singh, Yuvraj Singh, Gurkirat Singh, Mandeep Singh, Siddharth Kaul, Manan Vohra, Sandeep Sharma, Barinder Saran, Shubman Gill, Mayank Markande, Abhishek Sharma and Sharad Lumba. Shubman Gill, Abhishek Sharma and Arshdeep Singh were selected for the U-19 world cup played in New Zealand which India won. Abhishek Sharma also captained the U-19 team in the Asia Cup. Siddharth Kaul was selected for the Indian team for the England tour for one day and T-20. Shubman Gill and Anmolpreet Singh were selected for India –A team.

Taniya Bhatia women cricketer of our state was selected to represent India in T-20 tournaments.

PCA received the best ground award for IPL and also another for Ranji Trophy. This has been the result of a year around hard work put in by the staff.

INDIA VS SRI LANKA ODI 13TH DECEMBER, 2017

PCA hosted the India - Sri Lanka 2nd ODI on 13th December 2017 at IS Bindra PCA stadium Mohali. India won the match by 141 runs. Rohit Sharma led India in absence of Virat Kohli while Sri Lanka was led by Thisara Perera. Sri Lanka won the toss and chose to bowl first. India opened with skipper Rohit Sharma and Shikhar Dhawan who put on 115 runs for the 1st wicket in 21.1 overs before Shikhar Dhawan got out for 68 off 67 balls

with nine boundaries. His departure brought in Shreyas Iyer who joined the skipper for a 213 runs 2nd wicket stand which was broken when Shreyas Iyer got out for 88 off 78 balls with nine boundaries and 2 sixes with the teams total reading 328 for 2 in 45.3 overs. Skipper Rohit Sharma went on to blast an unbeaten double century (208) off 153 balls studded with 30 well struck boundaries and 12 huge sixes. India innings ended at 392 for 4 in

the allotted 50 overs. For Sri Lanka Thisara Parera 3 for 80 was the most successful bowler.

Replying Sri Lanka could score 251 for 8 in the allotted 50 overs. The highlight of the Sri Lankan innings was an unbeaten century by AD Mathews 111 no off 132 balls inclusive 9 boundaries and 3 soaring sixes. The bowling honours were shared by Yuzvender Chahal 3 for 60 Jasprit Bumrah 2 for 43, Bhuvnesh Kumar 1 for 40, Hardik Pandya 1 for 39 and Washington Sundar 1 for 65. Rohit Sharma was declared the man of the match.

INDIAN PREMIERE LEAGUE 2018.

Three home matches of Kings XI Punjab were played at IS Bindra PCA Stadium Mohali. The first match between Kings XI Punjab and Delhi Daredevils was played on 8th April 2018. It was the 2nd match of the IPL league and was played as a day and night game. Batting first Delhi Daredevils went on to score 166 for 7 in 20 overs with the run rate of 8.3. Delhi Daredevils was led by Gautam Gambhir and Kings XI was led by R Ashwin. Skipper Gautam Gambhir led from the front scoring 55 of 42 balls with 5 boundaries and 2 sixes before being run out by M. Rehman. Rishab Pant also scored a quick fire 28 off 13 balls with 4 boundaries and 1 six and Chris Morris bolstered the innings by blasting an unbeaten 27 off 16 balls with 1 boundary and 1 six. For Kings XI Punjab Mohit Sharma 2 for 33, M. Rehman 2 for 28, R. Ashwin 1 for 23, Axar Patel 1 for 35 shared the spoils. Chasing a target of 167 runs from 20 overs Kings XI scored 167 for 4 in 18.4 overs to win the match by 6 wickets and log 2 points while Delhi got 0. The Kings XI innings was bolstered by opener K.L. Rahul who hit a blistering half century (51) off 16 balls with 6 boundaries and 4 huge sixes with a strike rate of 318.75. He was assisted by K. K. Nair who scored 50 of 33 balls with 5 boundaries and 2 sixes. For Delhi Daredevils Trent Boult Chris Morris, D Christian and Rahul Tewatia shared one wicket each. K. L. Rahul of Kings XI was named player of the match.

For Chennai Super Kings Shardul Thakur 2 for 33 , Imran Tahir 2 for 34, Shane Watson 1 for 15 , D. Bravo 1 for 37 and Harbhajan Singh 1 for 41 were the main wicket takers. Replying Chennai Super Kings were 193

for 5 in 20 overs. Former Indian skipper M. S. Dhoni played an unbeaten electrifying innings of 79 off 44 balls inclusive of 6 boundaries and 5 huge sixes and he was ably supported by 49 off 35 balls with 5 boundaries and 1 six by Ambati Rayudu. For Kings XI Punnjab bowling honours were shared by Andrew Tye 2 for 47 R Ashiwn 2 for 32 and Mohit Sharma 1 for 47.

Chris Gayle opening for Kings XI Punjab sent the cricket fans into a tizzy by his swashbuckling batting in which he scored an unbeaten century 104 of 63 balls with one boundary and 11 towering sixes at a strike rate

165.7. Mayank Aggarwal 18 off 9 balls, Karun Nair 31 off 21 balls Aaron Finch unbeaten 14 of 6 balls and KL Rahul 18 off 21 balls helped KingsXI Punjab reach 193 for 3 in 20 overs. For Sunrisers Hyderabad Bhuvneshwar Kumar 1 for 25, Rashid Khan 1 for 55, SiddharthKaul 1 for 33 were the main wicket takers. Chasing a target of 194 in 20 overs Sunrisers Hyderabad could muster 178 for 4. K Williamson 54 off 41 balls , MK Pandey 57 off 42 balls and Shakib al Hasan unbeaten 24 off 12 balls

INTER STATE SENIOR DAYS TOURNAMENT FOR RANJI TROPHY.

Punjab were drawn in Pool-D along with Himachal, Vidarbha, Bengal, Services, Goa and Chhattisgarh. The Ranji Trophy matches were played on Home and Away basis. Punjab started their Ranji Trophy campaign on 6th October 2017 by taking on Himachal at HPCA Cricket Stadium, Dharamshala. Punjab conceded first innings lead to Himachal who garnered 3 points while Punjab got 01. Winning the toss Himachal opted to bat first. Himachal led by triple century by Prashant Chopra (338), S. L. Verma 79, P. K. Dogra 99 and A.K. Bains 80 posted 729 for 8 in 148 overs (Declared). Sandeep Sharma 4 for 149 and Manpreet Gony 2 for 145 were the pick of Punjab bowlers. Punjab replied with 601 all out in 154.3

overs. Abhishek Gupta 202, Abhishek Sharma 94, Pargat Singh 64, Jeevanjot Singh 59, Anmolpreet Singh 50, Gurkirat Mann 29 and Mayank Sidana 31 being the main run getters for Punjab. G. K. Singh 6 for 162 was the most successful bowler for Himachal. Himachal in their second innings scored 145 for 6 in 40 overs at the close of final days play. Prashant Chopra 22, Rishi Dhawan 25, P. K. Dogra UNBEATEN 25, A. P. Vashisht unbeaten 23 being the main contributors with the bat for Himachal. For Punjab Sandeep Sharma 2 for 34, Manpreet Gony 2 for 20 and Barinder Singh Sran 2 for 38 were the most successful bowlers.

The second match of the tournament was played at I. S. Bindra Stadium, PCA Mohali against



Vidarbha from 14-17 October, 2017. Punjab lost the match by innings. Vidarbha got 7 points while Punjab got zero. After winning the toss and electing to bat, Punjab rattled up 161 in 42.2 overs before being bowled out. Abhishek Gupta 89, Yuvraj Singh 20 and Manpreet Gony 14 were the most successful batsmen for Punjab while Lalit Yadav 3 for 47, Siddhesh Sunil Neral 3 for 48, R. N. Gurbani 2 for 20 and A. K. Karnewar 2 for 10 were the successful bowlers for Vidarbha.

Replying Vidarbha amassed 505 run in 153.2 overs with Ganesh Satish 164, S. R. Ramaswamy 161, A. V. Wankhade 32, F. Y. Fazal 21, A. K. Karnewar 34, Lalit Yadav 25 being the highest run getters. Sandeep Sharma 2 for 61, Manpreet Gony 2 for 93 and Abhishek Sharma 4 for 136 were the most successful bowlers for Punjab. Punjab were again bowled out in the 2nd innings for 227 in 72.1 overs with Manan Vohra 51, Pargat Singh 28, Yuvraj Singh 42 and Abhishek Sharma 49 being the principal run getters. A. K. Karnewar 6 for 47 and A. A. Wakhare 4 for 83 were the most successful bowlers for Vidarbha.

The third match of the tournament was played at Goa against Goa from 24-27 Oct.,2017. Punjab won the match by an innings to garner 7 points while Goa got zero. Winning the toss and opting to bat, Punjab scored 635 in 148.5 with double century by Jiwanjot Singh (238), centuries by Anmolpreet Singh (113) and Gurkeerat Mann (114), Uday Kaul 66, Abhishek Gupta 25 and Taruwar Kohli 28 being the other contributors. For Goa Shadav Jakati 5 for 165 and R. R. Singh 2 for 36 were the successful bowlers. Replaying Goa were bowled out for 246 in 79.4 overs. Sumiran

Amonkar 30, Sugum Kamat 47, Swapnil A. Asnodkar 29 and Anil Yadav 52 not out were the main run getters for Goa while for Punjab Raghu Sharma 4 for 50, Vinay Choudhary 3 for 72 and Siddharth Kaul 2 for 41 were the successful bowlers. Forced to follow on Goa scored 256 all out in 88.1 overs. Darshan Misal unbeaten 64, R. R. Singh 51, Sagun Kamat 34 and Swapnil Asnodkar 26 were the successful batsmen for Goa while Vinay Chaudhary 3 for 57, Raghu Sharma 3 for 117 and Manpreet Grewal 2 for 8 were the successful bowlers for Punjab.

Punjab's next encounter against Chhatisgarh at Raipur was played from 01-04 Nov.,2017. Punjab won by an innings and 118 runs to garner 7 points while Chhatisgarh got zero. After winning the toss and electing to bat first, Chhatisgarh were all out at 238 in 73 overs. Vishal Singh 76, S. S. Ruikar 50 and Jatin Sahai Saxena 52 were the main run getters for Chhatisgarh. For Punjab Sandeep Sharma 2 for 41, Manpreet Grewal 4 for 41 and Vinay Chaudhary 3 for 56 were the most successful bowlers. Replaying Punjab declared their innings at 653 for 9 in 128.1 overs. Anmolpreet Singh (267), Gurkirat Mann (111), Jiwanjot Singh (75) and Vinay Chaudhary (49) were the main run getters for Punjab. P. R. Sinha 3 for 21, S. S. Kharwar 3 for 107 and S.S. Ruikar 3 for 174 were the main wicket takers for Chhatisgarh. In their second innings Chhatisgarh were bowled out at 297 in 102.4 overs. Ashutosh Singh 119, Abhimanyu Chauhan 36, S. S. Ruikar 36, Abhimanyu 36, Vishal Singh 45 were the main scorers for Chhatisgarh while for Punjab Sandeep Sharma 4 for 89, Barinder Singh Sran 3 for 65 and

Vinay Chaudhary 2 for 70 were the main wicket takers.

Punjab's next match against Bengal at Gandhi Grounds Amritsar was played from 17-20 Nov. Punjab lost the match to Bengal by an innings and 19 runs. Bengal garnered 7 points while Punjab got zero. Winning the toss and electing to bat first, Punjab were all out at 147 in 46 overs. Shubman Gill 63 was the successful batsman for Punjab, while P. Parmanik 3 for 41 and B. Amit 3 for 31 were the main wicket takers for Bengal. Replaying Bengal declared their first innings at 379 for 9 in 116 overs. Abhishek Kumar Raman 155, A. R. Eswaran 117, Shreevats Goswami 29 and Amir Gani 35 not out were the main scorers for Bengal. Siddharth Kaul 5 for 118 was the main wicket taker for Punjab. In the second innings Punjab again were bowled out for 213 with Anmolpreet Singh 40, Gurkeerat Mann 57, Vinay Chaudhary unbeaten 23, Shubman Gill 21 and Abhishek Gupta 21 being the most successful batsmen for Punjab. Ishan Porel 5 for 32, P. Pramanik 2 for 72 and B. Amit 2 for 35 were the successful wicket takers for Bengal.

The last match of the Ranji trophy league was played against Services at Gandhi Grounds Amritsar from 25-28 Nov.,2017. The match was

drawn however Punjab got 3 points for first innings lead, while Services got one. Services won the toss and elected to field. Punjab declared their first innings at 645 for 6 in 138 overs. Shubman Gill 129, Anmolpreet Singh 252 not out, Jiwanjot Singh 64, Gurkeerat Mann 70, Abhishek Gupta 60 were the main run getters for Punjab. Diwesh Gurdev Pathania 1 for 70, Sachidanand Pandey 1 for 120, V. Yadav 01 for 137, Raj Bahadur Pal 1 for 122, Nitin Tanwar 1 for 70 and Ravi Chauhan 1 for 19 were the main wicket takers for Services. Replaying Services were bowled out at 315 in 71.2 overs. Rahul Singh 48, Vikas 42, Nakul Verma 38 were the most successful batsmen for Services while Manpreet Grewal 5 for 63 and Siddharth Kaul 2 for 101 were the main wicket takers for Punjab. Forced to follow on Services scored 458 runs in 105 overs in their second innings with Rahul Singh 124, Ravi Chauhan 112, Vikas 41 and Raj Bahadur 52 being the main run getters. For Punjab Siddharth Kaul 3 for 98, Manpreet Grewal 2 for 98 and Harbhajan Singh 2 for 107 were the most successful bowlers.

Punjab ended the Ranji Trophy campaign with 18 points and missed the knock out stage of the tournament as they got no.3 position in the group.

Punjab started their campaign against Haryana at Alur Cricket Stadium Alur on 7 February, 2018. Haryana defeated Punjab by 2 wickets and garnered 4 points while Punjab got zero. Winning the toss Haryana decided to field first. Punjab scored 247 for 9 in 50 overs. Shubman Gill 25, Mandeep Singh 35, Yuvraj Singh 43, Gurkeerat Mann 42, Barinder Singh Sran 14 and Manpreet Grewal unbeaten 29 were the main run getters for Punjab. For Haryana H. V. 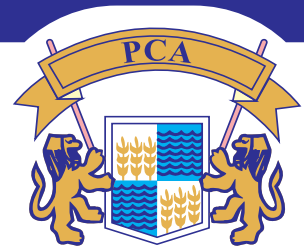
Punjab then travelled to Delhi to take on Delhi from 19-22 Nov., 2017. Punjab lost this

NORTH ZONE INTER STATE UNDER 14 YEARS TOURNAMENT FOR DHRUV PANDOVE TROPHY:

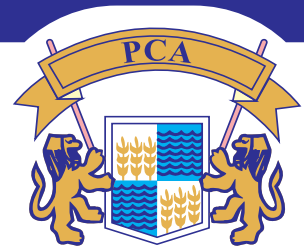

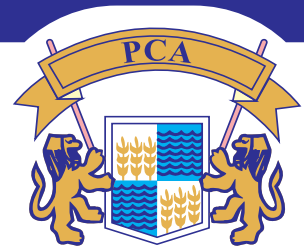

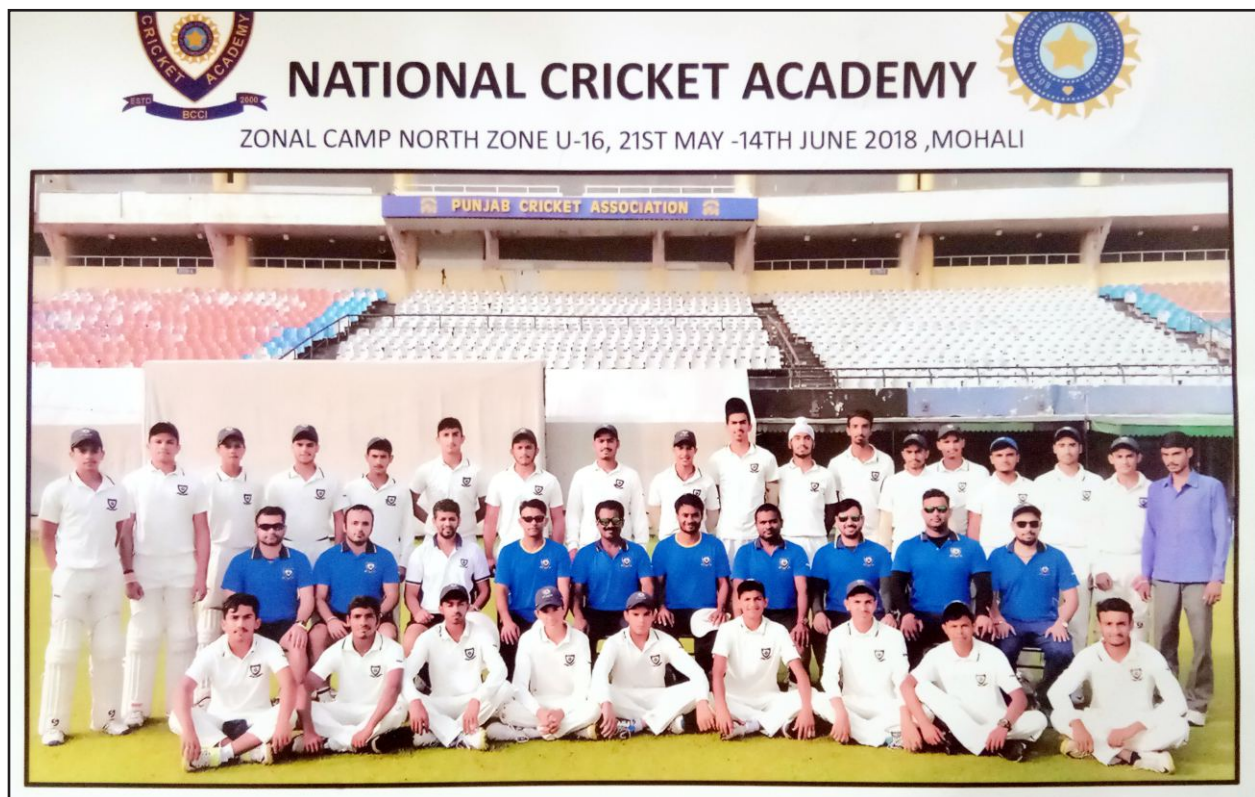

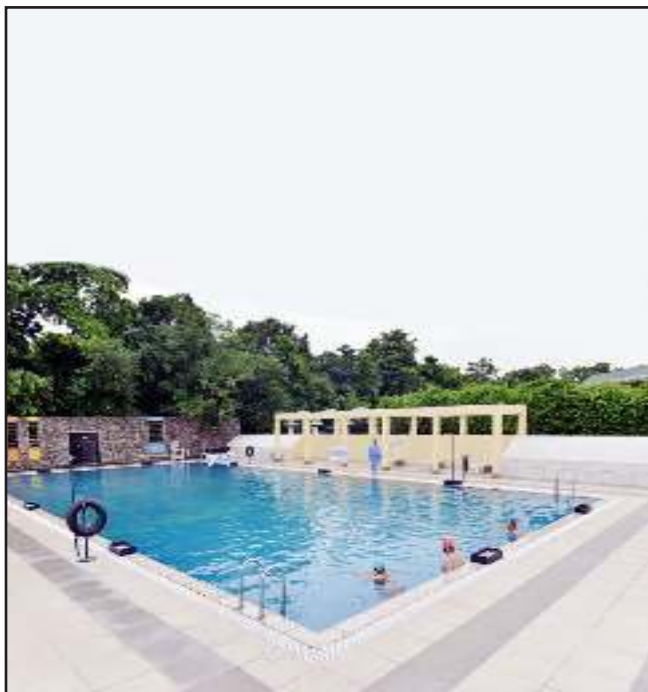
PCC's MEMBERS CLUB ACTIVITIES:

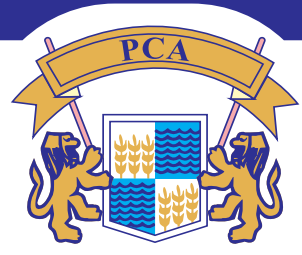

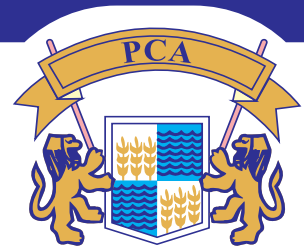

Significant Accounting Policies and Notes on accounts for the year ended 31- 03- 2018

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Background

The Punjab Cricket Association (The Association) has been registered as a Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 with the primary objective to promote, develop, control and regulate the game of Cricket in the State of Punjab and is affiliated to the Board of Control for Cricket in India.

b) Accounting Convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention, following the accrual concept of accounting in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India.

On the basis of the objectives of the Association as indicated in (a) above, the Association is a Small and Medium Sized Entity (SME) as defined by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI). Accordingly, the Accounting Standards issued by the ICAI and which are applicable to a Small and Medium Sized Entity, have been considered for the preparation of these accounts.

c) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires the Office Bearers to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) as of the date of the financial statements and the reported income and expenses during the reporting period. The Office Bearers believe that the estimates used in the preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable.

d) Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are valued at Cost.

e) Depreciation on all assets have been provided on WDV method at the rates specified in the Income Tax Rules, 1962. Assets used for a period of less than 180 days during the year are depreciated at 50% of the applicable rates as per the Income Tax Rules, 1962, in the year of acquisition and disposal.

Depreciation is accelerated on fixed assets, based on their condition, usability etc., as per the estimates of the Association, where necessary.

f) Income is recognized on accrual basis except for Share of Media Rights and Franchisee Consideration from BCCI which are being recognized at the time of actual receipt as the same is not ascertainable at the close of the year by the Association. The accounting policies have been consistently applied during the year except as provided otherwise elsewhere in notes to accounts.

g) Impairment of Assets

The carrying amount of relevant assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any indication exists, an assets's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of the asset exceeds the recoverable amount.

h) Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions are recognised only when there is a present or legal obligation as a result of past

events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefit will be required to settle the transaction and a reliable estimate can be made for the amount of the obligation. Contingent liability is disclosed for (i) Possible obligations which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the entity or (ii) Present obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made. Contingent assets are not recognised in the financial statements since this may result in the recognition of income that may never be realised.

2. Notes on Accounts:

- a) The Association is entitled for Infrastructure subsidy from BCCI against capital expenditure incurred for Expansion of Stadium and creation of additional facilities and new infrastructure. The same is being accounted for as and when received.
- b) Some of the balances appearing under sundry debtors, sundry creditors and loans and advances are subject to confirmation from respective parties.
- c) Expenses reimbursed to Staff / Executive Members have been incurred for the official purpose of Punjab Cricket Association and no element of personal expenses have been charged to Income and Expenditure account. Further the assets of the Association have not been utilized, directly or indirectly, for the benefit of the Office Bearers.
- d) The Cricket consumables and other consumable items etc. have been charged to Income and Expenditure account as and when purchased.
- e) The Association remitted lease money amounting to Rs. 1356 for each year for the years 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 respectively in respect of land of PCA Cricket stadium, Mohali to the Director of Sports, Punjab vide Demand Draft. The same has been returned to the association since the court cases are pending in the Hon'ble Court. The Association expects a favourable decision with regards to the disputes and believes that no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.
- f) During the previous financial year, the Association had received a total amount of Rs.51,75,00,000/- from BCCI against which an amount of Rs.26,47,01,646/- had been considered as "Advance from BCCI" under Current liabilities, as advised by BCCI. During the current year, the PCA had requested BCCI to confirm the amount due on account of Share of Media rights and Franchisee consideration. The Chief Financial Officer, BCCI vide his email dated 14th August 2018 has informed "Please note that the annual accounts of BCCI for F.Y 2016-17 are yet to be formally adopted in the BCCI- Annual General Meeting. Hence at this stage, we won't be able to provide you the details of "Amount Due to Associations" of PCA". In view of above, no revenue is being recognized on this account during the year as same could not be reasonably determined. Further Rs.26,47,01,646/- is being retained as "Advance from BCCI" under current liabilities.
- g) The Land of 19 Kanal and 11 Marla i.e. 2.44375 Acres at New Mullanpur has been compulsory acquired by GMADA for the construction of Master Plan Roads. As per their letter dated 28th February 2017, the total compensation awarded to PCA is Rs.153.40 Lacs.

In addition, GMADA has claimed an amount of Rs.375.66 Lacs as External Development (EDC) Charges and an amount of Rs.227.28 Lacs as PR-4 Road Cess charges.

The Association has contested the above compensation awarded and the above charges levied (EDC and PR-4 Cess)

Accordingly considering the grounds of uncertainty in determination of various amounts, no accounting entries have been made in the books of accounts for the above transactions. Consequential adjustments shall be made on final settlement of the matter.



h) Income Tax Status:

- i)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2001-02 to 2007-08(Asstt Year 2002-03 to 2008-09) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 16,78,52,435. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal), which was decided in its favour. The Department had gone on appeal against the order of the CIT (A) before the ITAT. The ITAT during the current financial year, has passed an order and has remanded back the matter to CIT(Appeals) for re examine in light of the provisions under Section 11(4A) of the Income Tax Act,1961.
- ii)** The Commissioner of Income Tax-II, passed order dated 31-03-09 for the cancellation of registration u/s 12-A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 granted to Punjab Cricket Association from assessment year 2009-10 onwards in view of amended provisions of Section 2(15) of the Income Tax Act. The Association had filed an appeal in the Appellant Tribunal, Chandigarh against the aforesaid order. The Appellate Tribunal vide its order dated 27-08-09 has set aside the above said order. In view of the ITAT order, Commissioner of Income Tax-II, restored registration u/s 12A of the Income Tax Act, 1961. The Department has filed an appeal before the High Court of Punjab and Haryana against the order of the ITAT, which is pending.
- iii)** The Commissioner of Income Tax-II, passed order dated 21-06-2012 for the cancellation of registration u/s 12-A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 granted to Punjab Cricket Association from assessment year 2009-10 onwards in view of amended provisions of Section 2(15) and section 12 AA(3) of the Income Tax Act. The Association filed an appeal against the aforesaid order before Income Tax Appellate Tribunal. The Income Tax Appellate Tribunal passed order on 19th October 2015 in favour of PCA and restoring the exemption of PCA u/s 12A of the Income Tax Act. The Department has filed an appeal before the High Court of Punjab and Haryana against the order of the ITAT, which is pending.
- iv)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2008-09 (assessment Year 2009-10) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 11,52,62,650/-. The amount demanded Rs. 2,72,05,104/- , after adjustment of TDS and amount refundable Rs. 8,80,57,546/- in respect of other years, has been deposited by the association under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.
- v)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2009-10 (assessment Year 2010-11) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 12,28,61,350/- which has been deposited by the association under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT (Appeals). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT (Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.
- vi)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2010-11 (Assessment Year 2011-12) by treating that the association has lost its character of

charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 22,19,80,520/- which has been deposited by the association under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.

vii) The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial year 2011-12 (Assessment Year 2012-13) by treating that association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 11,78,97,820/-. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs.5,89,48,914/- under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending. The Association during the current year i.e. financial year 2016-17 has further deposited an amount of Rs.2,23,00,000/- under protest making a total payment of Rs.8,12,48,914/- against the total demand.

viii) The Income Tax department has made assessment for the financial year 2012-13 (Assessment Year 2013-14) by treating that association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs.12,61,25,080/-. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs.8,20,00,000/- under protest against the above order. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.

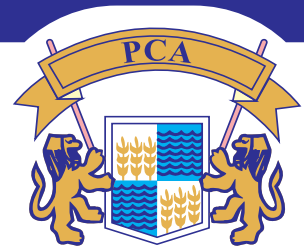
ix) The Income Tax department has made assessment for the financial year 2013-14 (Assessment Year 2014-15) by treating that association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs.2,94,45,710/-, after adjustment of TDS and Advance Tax of Rs.12.45 Crores deposited.

The Association has deposited an amount of Rs.1,92,00,000/- under protest against the above order. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal) which is pending.

x) The Income Tax department has made assessment for the financial year 2014-15 (Assessment Year 2015-16) by treating that association has lost its character of character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 11,74,59,686/- after adjustment of TDS. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs. 7,35,00,000/- under protest against the above order. Further the Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeals) which is pending.

The Association expects a favourable decision with respect to the income tax disputes based on professional advice and, hence, believes that no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.

i) PCA has received orders from Commissioner (Appeals), Service Tax regarding taxability on amount received on Associate Membership fee, sponsorship for interschool tournaments, share of catering received from caterer and held orders in favour of the department. PCA has further filed appeal with CESTAT, based on professional advice and deposited full Service Tax amounting to Rs. 10,23,645/- under protest. The same has been shown under the head



“Service Tax deposit under protest” in Current Assets, Loans and Advances. PCA believes that no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.

j) During the Financial Year 2015-16, PCA has received orders from Assistant Commissioner, Service Tax regarding levy of Service Tax on share of catering under “Business Support Service” and confirm the taxability. As advised by Tax Consultant, PCA has deposited an amount of Rs.26,000 being 7.5% of the Service Tax under protest and filed an appeal with Commissioner (Appeals). The case is still pending.

k) OTHER CLAIMS AGAINST THE ASSOCIATION NOT ACKNOWLEDGED AS DEBTS

- i.** The Police Department, Punjab and Chandigarh has raised claims for deploying Police during matches, amounting to Rs. 42.15 Crores as on 31.03.2018. The above figure also contains the claims for deployment of Police during IPL Matches, which as per tripartite agreement between BCCI, PCA and Franchisee, belongs to IPL Franchisee. The IPL franchisee is directly taking up the matter with Police department. The PCA on its part are contesting the claims, as those are not payable in terms of Police Rules.
- ii.** The Association has received claims from other government departments and other parties for an amount of Rs. 11.92 Lacs (to the extent quantifiable) as on 31st March, 2018. The amounts shown above represents the best possible estimates arrived at on the basis of the available information.

In the opinion of the Association, the above claims against the Association are not sustainable and hence, no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.

l) PREVIOUS YEAR FIGURES

Previous year's figures have been regrouped / reclassified wherever necessary, to conform to the current year's classification.
