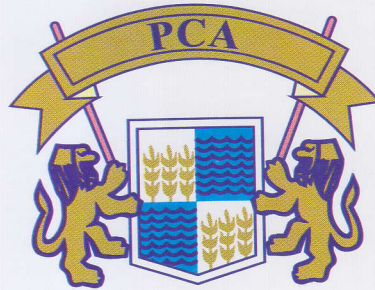

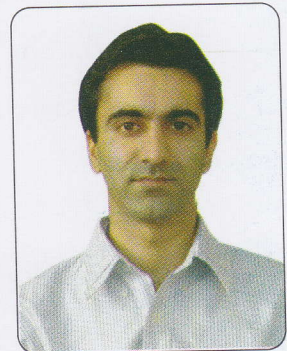

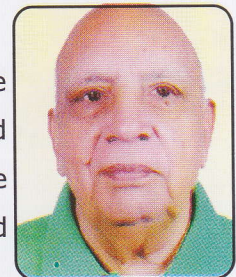

ANNUAL REPORT – 2018-2019

We have the pleasure and privilege of presenting the 70th annual report of the association duly approved by the executive committee.

The year under report has been very productive for the association on and off the field. The association organised matches at senior and junior levels for age groups tournaments through the inter district competitions so that the best talent of the state was available for selection for the state team to take part in the inter-state national tournament. There has been lot of emphasis on fitness for which various periodic fitness camps were held at IS Bindra PCA Stadium Mohali and Dhruv Pandove stadium Patiala before the start of the National domestic season. Our senior team playing in the elite Group of Ranji Trophy and was in running for the knock out berth till their last match against Bengal. The match was drawn and Punjab's hopes of making it to the knock out stage were shattered. In the one day Vijay Hazare tournament the team once again failed to make it to the knock out stage. In the T-20 tournament for Syed Mushtaq Ali trophy we failed to qualify for the super league. Our first success came in the U-23 Col CK Nayudu trophy which we won by 1 wicket by defeating Bengal in a cliff hanger at Dhruv Pandove stadium Patiala. In the U-23 one day tournament Punjab lost to Vidarbha in the semi-finals. In the U-19 Cooch Behar trophy Punjab could not reach the knock out stage. The team also failed to make it to the knock out stage in One day u-19 Vinoo Mankad

trophy. The Punjab U-16 team could not clear the North Zone league stage for the Vijay merchant trophy.

Our U-19 women team made it to the quarter finals of one day tournament. In the T-20 women U-19 qualified for the super league. In the U-23 one day tournament for women the team did not qualify. In U-23 T-20 team qualified for the super league. The senior women team failed to qualify in One day tournament where as the senior T-20 team became the National Champions.

15 Punjab players represented various franchisee teams in IPL 12 namely Harbhajan Singh, Yuvraj Singh, Gurkirat Singh, Mandeep Singh, Siddharth Kaul, Manan Vohra, Sandeep Sharma, Shubman Gill, Barinder Sran, Mayank Markande, Abhishek Sharma, Arshdeep Singh, Harpreet Brar, Prabsimran Singh and Anmolpreet Singh.

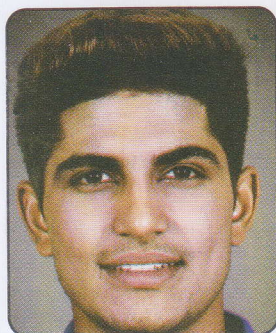

PCA received best ground award for IPL-12. This has been result of year round hard work by the staff.



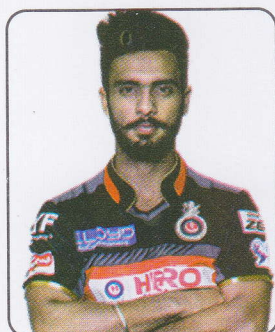

RETIREMENT OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS OF PCA

3 players Yuvraj Singh, Vikram Rajvir Singh, and Mapreet Singh Garewal retired from all forms of the game during the year under report. The association wishes them a pleasant retired life and the very best in the 2nd innings of their respective careers. The association is also beholden to them for the good work as players while donning the state colours

Born on December 12th 1981 in Chandigarh Yuvraj made rapid strides as a young southpaw getting into the big league through the U-19 world cup in which he represented the country in 1999. He caught the fancy of the fans as soon as he made his ODI debut at Nairobi Gymkhana on October 3 2000. His Test debut came against Newzeland at his home ground Mohali in October 2003 while his T-20 debut was against Scotland at Durban in Sept 2007

As a middle order left handed batsman he turned out many sterling displays for his country and later on his slow left arm spinners came very handy at crucial moments in the matches. He became the most feared batsman in One day and T-20 cricket and has the sole distinction of hitting six consecutive sixes off the bowling of England fast bowler Stuart Broad in a world cup encounter.

His tenacity was in full flow when despite a life threatening disease affecting his lungs. He went on to help India win the 2011 world cup with his brilliant all round display which won him the man of the series award.



Yuvraj Singh

In the Indian Premier league he was one of the highest paid stars who played for six franchisees. The worthy scion of test player Yograj Singh the contemporary of legendary Kapil Dev, finally hung up his boots on 10th June 2019 after having played 40 test matches, 304 ODI, 58 T-20 matches, 139 First class matches, 423 List –A matches and 231 T-20s. He played his last test against England at Kolkata in December 2012. Last ODI against West Indies in June 2017. Last T-20 against England at Bengaluru in Feb 2017. Making his first class debut in 1996-97 he played his last first class for Punjab against Bengal at Kolkata in January 2019. Made his List-A debut in 1999 played his last List-A match for Punjab against Karnataka in October 2018. His retirement has brought down curtains on illustrious career of a Punjab player.



VRV Singh born on September 1984 at Chandigarh and played for India U-19, India and Punjab as a right arm medium fast bowler. The strapping fast bowlers career was plagued by his back injury which forced an early retirement. A gentleman cricketer he represented Punjab in 29 Ranji Trophy matches and captured 121 wickets with the best bowling of 7 for 75 with 10 five wickets haul and two 10 wickets hauls. In 37 list A matches he captured 55 wickets and in 33 T-20 outings he took 31 wickets. He made his test debut against Westindies in June 2006 and played his last test against Bangladesh in May 2007. In 5 test matches he captured 8 wickets and also represented the country in 2 ODI's. He made his

ODI debut against England in Jamshedpur. His Ranji debut was against UPCA at Mohali in November 2004 and his last Ranji match against J&K

in January 2014. He made his Debut in one day against Himachal in January 2014 and played last match also against Himachal in March 2008. He made his T-20 debut against Haryana in 2007 and the last T-20 match against Baroda in 2012. The Association wishes him the very best in his future endeavours.

Born on January 4, 1984 Manreet Gony played for Punjab as a right arm medium pacer in 61 matches capturing 196 wickets with 10 five wicket hauls and 2 ten wickets hauls. In One day he played 55 matches capturing 77 wickets while in T-20 he played 90 matches capturing 96 wickets. Played 2

odi's in 2008. Made his debut in Ranji trophy against Andhra in November 2007 and his last appearance against Bengal in January 7, 2019. He made one day debut against Haryana in February 2008 and played last match against Karnataka. His last T-20 match was against Railways in March 2019. He also played in IPL for different franchisees in different seasons. He retired from all forms of cricket in June 2019. The Association wishes him best of luck in his future endeavours.

INDIA VS AUSTRALIA 4TH ODI 10TH MARCH, 2019

PCA hosted the India- Australia one day Match on 10th March at IS Bindra PCA Stadium Mohali. Australia won the match by 4 wickets in a thrilling finish. Ashton Turner of Australia was named player of the match. Captain Virat Kohli won the toss and opted to bat first. India opened with its seasoned pair of Rohit Sharma and Shikhar Dhawan who raised 193 runs partnership in 31 overs at more than run a ball. The partnership was broken when Rohit Sharma was snapped by Handscomb off right arm fast bowler Richardson 5 short of his century 95 off 92 balls studded with 7 boundaries and 2 sixes. Shikhar Dhawan in the mean while continued to milk the Australian

bowling and was finally castled by Pat Cummins for an exhilarating century 143 off 115 balls spiced with 18 boundaries and 3 lusty sixes. Skipper Virat Kohli perished early being caught by wicket keeper Alex Carey off Richardson for 7. Rishab Pant 36 and Vijay Shankar 26 were the other contributors with the bat. India innings ended at 358 for 9 in 50 overs. Pat Cummins 5 for 70 and JA Richardson 3 for 85 were the most successful bowlers for Australia.

Replying Australia scored 359 for 6 in 47 overs to record a 4 wickets win. Australia innings was anchored by U T Khwaja 91 off 99 balls, century by P S P Handscomb 117 off 105 balls with

Seven home matches of Kings XI Punjab were played at IS Bindra PCA stadium Mohali. The first match against Mumbai Indians was played on 30th March 2019 which was won by Kings XI Punjab by 8 wickets . Mumbai Indians scored 176 for 7 in 20 overs with Quinton D Kock 60, Rohit Sharma 32 and Hardik Pandya 31 being the highest run getters. For Kings XI Mohd. Shami, Hardu Vijyon and Murgan Ashwin scalped 2 wickets each.

Replying KKR scored 183 for 3 in 18 overs. Shubman Gill unbeaten 65, Chris Lynn 46 being the main run getters. M.Shami, R Ashwin and Andrew Tye scalped 1 wicket each.

The last encounter at PCA stadium Mohali for the IPL season was played on 5th May 2019

between Kings XI and Chennai super Kings. Kings XI won by 6 wickets. Chennai batting first scored 170 for 5 in 20 overs. F du Plesis 96 and Suresh Raina 53 were the principal run getters for Chennai super Kings. M. Shami 2 for 17 and Sam Curran 3 for 35 were the main wicket takers for Kings XI. Replying Kings XI scored 173 for 4 in 18 overs. KL Rahul 71 Nichlos Pooran 36 being the main run getters for KXIP.

Punjab were drawn in pool-B along with Himachal, Andhra Praesh, Tamilnadu, Kerala, Delhi, Hyderabad, Bengal, Madhya Pradesh. The Ranji trophy matches were played on home and

INTER STATE SENIOR DAYS TOURNAMENT FOR RANJI TROPHY

Andhra Pradesh won the toss and put Punjab into bat. Punjab scored 414 in 156.2 overs. Punjab's innings was sustained by a maiden ton 110 by Sanvir Singh and useful knocks by Shubman Gill 56 skipper Mandeep Singh 68, Gurkirat Singh 41 and Mayank Markande unbeaten 63. For Andhra B Ayappa and KV Sharma scalped 3 wickets each while DP Vijay Kumar and Soib Mohd captured 2 wickets a piece. Andhra in reply made 423 in 158.5 overs led by a big hundred by Ricky Bhui and useful knocks by KS Bharat 76, S Sumanth 54 and Shoib Khan 52. Mayank Markande Right arm leg spinner 5 for 129 was the most successful bowler for Punjab. Andhra took the vital first innings lead to garner 3 points while Punjab got 1. Punjab in their 2nd essay were 102 for 2 in 33 overs when the match ended. Shubman Gill unbeaten 54 and Anmolpreet Singh 32 were the principal run getters for Punjab.

Punjab's 2nd match against Madhya Pradesh was played at Holkar Stadium Indore from 20th November 2018. Punjab won the toss and elected to bat but could muster only 293 in 84.4 overs. Opener Jiwanjot Singh hit a patient century 124 off 216 balls with the help of 15 boundaries. Other notable contributions came from Gurkirat Singh 66, Abhishek Sharma 41. KR Sain 5 for 62

and Avesh Khan 4 for 77 were the most successful bowlers for Madhya Pradesh. Replying Madhya Pradesh scored 318 in 124.2 overs. Naman Ojha 81, RM Podar 73, Y Dubey unbeaten 65 being their principal run getters. For Punjab Sanvir Singh scalped 2 wickets while Right arm leg spinner Mayank Markande got 4 wickets. Punjab in their 2nd essay declared their innings at 265 for 9 in 68 overs. Jiwanjot 39, Abhishek Sharma 79, Mandeep Singh unbeaten 65 were the main run getters for Punjab. For Madhya Pradesh IC Pandey 4 for 59, Avesh Khan 3 for 45, KR Singh 2 for 74 were the main wicket takers. MPCA in their 2nd Innings were 67 for 1 in 35 overs when match ended. Madhya Pradesh for their first innings lead got 3 points while Punjab got 1. Kuldeep Sen was declared man of the match.

Punjab took on Delhi in their 3rd league match at Ferozshah Kotla Delhi and recorded their first win in the league by 10 wickets to garner 7 points including a bonus. Delhi won the toss and chose to bat first. Their decision boomeranged as medium pacer Siddharth Kaul rattled their innings with a spell of 6 wickets conceding 32 runs and ably supported by left arm spinner Vinay Choudhary 3 wickets for 34 runs. Delhi were bundled out for 107 in 42.5 overs. Punjab in reply made 282 in 91.5

overs. Jiwanjot 39, Mandeep Singh 90 and Gurkirat Mann 40 being the principal run getters. Delhi in their 2nd essay floundered again and were bowled out for 179 in 84.2 overs. Left arm spinner Vinay Choudhary 4 for 39, Right arm leg spinner Mayank Markande 3 for 30 and Siddharth Kaul 3 for 54 engineered the Delhi debacle. Gautam Gambhir 60 was the main run getter for Delhi. Punjab knocked off 8 runs in 2.1 overs for their out right win. Punjab's skipper Mandeep Singh was named player of the match.

Punjab playing their 4th league match of the season at their home ground IS Bindra PCA Stadium Mohali was in for a shock when they lost their match to Himachal by an innings and 107 runs. Winning the toss and opting to field Punjab bowled out Himachal for 390 in 145.1 overs. All India U-19 Invitation Tournament for Dhruv Pandove Trophy

PCA organised the 7th All India U-19 at Patiala, Mohali and Ropar from 28th August to 12th September 2018. 8 teams MPCA, UPCA, invitational tournament for Dhruv Pandove trophy

Mumbai CA, Baroda CA, Chhattisgarh CA, and Punjab CA took part in the tournament. The tournament is played in the memory of Late Dhruv Pandove an outstanding young player of Punjab who died in a freak road accident at a young age of 18 years. washed away which took the points tally to 11 with NRR .0834. UPCA with 10 points with Mumbai CA with 7 points, Baroda with 7 points and Chhattisgarh with 4 points followed in that order in the league stage.

Vashisht 55 led the MPCA batting assault while Deepanshu Chadha 3 for 23 and Anurag Vats 2 for 32 did most of the damage for Punjab. Punjab chased down the revised target of 111 in 24.4 overs to win the match by 8 wickets. Ishan Goel remaining unbeaten on 50 while Arjun Azad contributed 35. Punjab won the match by 8 wickets on VJD method and pocketed prize money of Rs 1 lakh and winner trophy while MPCA got prize money of Rs 50000 and runners up trophy.

Deepanshu Chadha 24 wickets and 366 runs with 3 five wickets haul and Dipin Chitkara 323 runs were the most successful bowlers for Punjab in the tournament. In batting Arjun Azad with 350 runs highest score 151 with 1 century and 2 fifties, Pukhraj Mann 277 highest score 115 with 1 century and 1 fifty and Prabhsimran Singh 236 with highest score 101 1 century and 1 fifty were the most successful batsman for Punjab in the tournament.

New International Cricket Stadium at Mullanpur (New Chandigarh)



Significant Accounting Policies and Notes on accounts for the year ended 31- 03- 2019

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Background

The Punjab Cricket Association (The Association) has been registered as a Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 with the primary objective to promote, develop, control and regulate the game of Cricket in the State of Punjab and is affiliated to the Board of Control for Cricket in India.

b) Accounting Convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention, following the accrual concept of accounting in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India.

On the basis of the objectives of the Association as indicated in (a) above, the Association is a Small and Medium Sized Entity (SME) as defined by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI). Accordingly, the Accounting Standards issued by the ICAI and which are applicable to a Small and Medium Sized Entity, have been considered for the preparation of these accounts.

c) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires the Office Bearers to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) as of the date of the financial statements and the reported income and expenses during the reporting period. The Office Bearers believe that the estimates used in the preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable.

d) Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are valued at Cost.

e) Depreciation on all assets have been provided on WDV method at the rates specified in the Income Tax Rules, 1962. Assets used for a period of less than 180 days during the year are depreciated at 50% of the applicable rates as per the Income Tax Rules, 1962, in the year of acquisition and disposal.

f) Income is recognized on accrual basis except for Share of Media Rights and Franchisee Consideration from BCCI which are being recognized at the time of actual receipt as the same is not ascertainable at the close of the year by the Association. The accounting policies have been consistently applied during the year except as provided otherwise elsewhere in notes to accounts.

g) Impairment of Assets

The carrying amount of relevant assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any indication exists, an asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of the asset exceeds the recoverable amount.

h) Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions are recognised only when there is a present or legal obligation as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefit will be required to settle the transaction and a reliable estimate can be made for the amount of the obligation.

Contingent liability is disclosed for (i) Possible obligations which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the entity or (ii) Present obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made. Contingent assets are not recognised in the financial statements since this may result in the recognition of income that may never be realised.

2. Notes on Accounts:

- a) The Association is entitled for Infrastructure subsidy from BCCI against capital expenditure incurred for Expansion of Stadium and creation of additional facilities and new infrastructure. The same is being accounted for as and when received.
- b) Some of the balances appearing under sundry debtors, sundry creditors and loans and advances are subject to confirmation from respective parties.
- c) Expenses reimbursed to Staff / Executive Members have been incurred for the official purpose of Punjab Cricket Association and no element of personal expenses have been charged to Income and Expenditure account. Further the assets of the Association have not been utilized, directly or indirectly, for the benefit of the Office Bearers.
- d) The Cricket consumables and other consumable items etc. have been charged to Income and Expenditure account as and when purchased.
- e) The Association remitted lease money amounting to Rs. 1356 for each year for the years 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 respectively in respect of land of PCA Cricket Stadium, Mohali to the Director of Sports, Punjab vide Demand Draft. The same has been returned to the association since the court cases are pending in the Hon'ble Court. The Association expects a favourable decision with regards to the disputes and believes that no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.
- f) During the year 2017-18, the PCA had requested BCCI to confirm the amount due on account of Share of Media rights and Franchisee consideration. The Chief Financial Officer, BCCI vide his email dated 14th August 2018 has informed "Please note that the annual accounts of BCCI for F.Y 2016-17 are yet to be formally adopted in the BCCI- Annual General Meeting. Hence at this stage, we won't be able to provide you the details of "Amount Due to Associations" of PCA". Accordingly, no revenue was recognized on this account during the year 2017-18 as same could not be reasonably determined. During the current financial year, the association had again requested the BCCI to confirm the amount due to association on account of share of Media rights and Franchisee consideration, however the confirmation/information is still pending from BCCI. In the absence of confirmations from BCCI, status quo has been maintained and consequently, no revenue is being recognized during the current year.
- g) The Land of 19 Kanal and 11 Marla i.e. 2.44375 Acres at New Mullanpur has been compulsory acquired by GMADA for the construction of Master Plan Roads. As per their letter dated 28th February 2017, the total compensation awarded to PCA is Rs. 153.40 Lacs.
In addition, GMADA has claimed an amount of Rs. 375.66 Lacs as External Development (EDC) Charges and an amount of Rs. 227.28 Lacs as PR-4 Road Cess charges.
The Association has contested the above compensation awarded and the above charges levied (EDC and PR-4 Cess)
Accordingly considering the grounds of uncertainty in determination of various amounts, no accounting entries have been made in the books of accounts for the above transactions. Consequential adjustments shall be made on final settlement of the matter.
- h) **Income Tax Status:**
 - i) The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2001-02 to 2007-08 (Asstt Year 2002-03 to 2008-09) by treating that the association has lost its

character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 16,78,52,435. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal), which was decided in its favour. The Department had gone on appeal against the order of the CIT (A) before the ITAT. The ITAT has passed an order and has remanded back the matter to CIT (Appeals) for re examine in light of the provisions under Section 11(4A) of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

- ii)** The Commissioner of Income Tax-II, passed order dated 31-03-09 for the cancellation of registration u/s 12-A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 granted to Punjab Cricket Association from assessment year 2009-10 onwards in view of amended provisions of Section 2 (15) of the Income Tax Act. The Association had filed an appeal in the Appellant Tribunal, Chandigarh against the aforesaid order. The Appellate Tribunal vide its order dated 27-08-09 has set aside the above said order. In view of the ITAT order, Commissioner of Income Tax-II, restored registration u/s 12A of the Income Tax Act, 1961. The Department has filed an appeal before the High Court of Punjab and Haryana against the order of the ITAT, which is pending.
- iii)** The Commissioner of Income Tax-II, passed order dated 21-06-2012 for the cancellation of registration u/s 12-A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 granted to Punjab Cricket Association from assessment year 2009-10 onwards in view of amended provisions of Section 2(15) and section 12 AA (3) of the Income Tax Act. The Association filed an appeal against the aforesaid order before Income Tax Appellate Tribunal. The Income Tax Appellate Tribunal passed order on 19th October 2015 in favour of PCA and restoring the exemption of PCA u/s 12A of the Income Tax Act. The Department has filed an appeal before the High Court of Punjab and Haryana against the order of the ITAT, which is pending.
- iv)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2008-09 (assessment Year 2009-10) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 11,52,62,650/-. The amount demanded Rs. 2,72,05,104/-, after adjustment of TDS and amount refundable Rs. 8,80,57,546/- in respect of other years, has been deposited by the association under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.
- v)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2009-10 (assessment Year 2010-11) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 12,28,61,350/- which has been deposited by the association under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT (Appeals). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT (Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.
- vi)** The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial years 2010-11 (Assessment Year 2011-12) by treating that the association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 22,19,80,520/- which has been deposited by the association under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.

vii) The Income tax Department has made assessment for the financial year 2011-12 (Assessment Year 2012-13) by treating that association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 11,78,97,820/-. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs.5,89,48,914/- under protest. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending. The Association during the financial year 2016-17 has further deposited an amount of Rs.2,23,00,000/- under protest making a total payment of Rs. 8,12,48,914/- against the total demand.

viii) The Income Tax department has made assessment for the financial year 2012-13 (Assessment Year 2013-14) by treating that association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 12,61,25,080/-. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs.8,20,00,000/- under protest against the above order. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal). During the year ended 31st March 2017, the CIT(Appeals) through its order confirmed the appeal in favour of the Income Tax Department. The Association has filed an appeal with the ITAT against the orders of CIT (Appeals) which is pending.

ix) The Income Tax department has made assessment for the financial year 2013-14 (Assessment Year 2014-15) by treating that association has lost its character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 2,94,45,710/-, after adjustment of TDS and Advance Tax of Rs. 12.45 Crores deposited.

The Association has deposited an amount of Rs. 1,92,00,000/- under protest against the above order. The Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeal) which is pending.

x) The Income Tax department has made assessment for the financial year 2014-15 (Assessment Year 2015-16) by treating that association has lost its character of character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 11,74,59,686/- after adjustment of TDS. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs. 7,35,00,000/- under protest against the above order. Further the Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeals) which is pending.

xi) The Income Tax department, during the current financial year, has made assessment for the financial year 2015-16 (Assessment Year 2016-17) by treating that association has lost its character of character of charitable organization and treating the entire surplus as business profit and raised a demand of Rs. 12,57,92,157/- after adjustment of TDS. The Association has deposited an amount of Rs. 2,52,00,000/- under protest against the above order. Further the Association has filed an appeal before the CIT(Appeals) which is pending.

The Association expects a favourable decision with respect to the income tax disputes based on professional advice and, hence, believes that no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.

i) PCA has received orders from Commissioner (Appeals), Service Tax regarding taxability on amount received on Associate Membership fee, sponsorship for interschool tournaments, share of catering received from caterer and held orders in favour of the department. PCA has further filed appeal with CESTAT, based on professional advice and deposited full Service Tax amounting to Rs. 10,23,645/- under protest. The same has been shown under the head "Service Tax deposit under protest" in Current Assets, Loans and Advances. PCA believes that

no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.

- j)** During the Financial Year 2015-16, PCA has received orders from Assistant Commissioner, Service Tax regarding levy of Service Tax on share of catering under "Business Support Service" and confirm the taxability. As advised by Tax Consultant, PCA has deposited an amount of Rs. 26,000 being 7.5% of the Service Tax under protest and filed an appeal with Commissioner (Appeals). The case is still pending.
- k)** During the current financial year, the association has paid an amount of Rs. 4,57,00,000/- to Punjab Police, as one time settlement for all previous police claims till December 2018. Accordingly, the amount has been shown in the Income and Expenditure account under the head "Settlement with Punjab Police till December 2018".
- l)** Balances with Banks (including FDR's) amounting to Rs. 142,87,26,175/-, as appearing in books of accounts, are free from any lien or any charge or pledge to any third party including banks.

m) OTHER CLAIMS AGAINST THE ASSOCIATION NOT ACKNOWLEDGED AS DEBTS

- i.** The Police Department, Chandigarh has raised claims for deploying Police during matches, amounting to Rs. 8.92 Crores as on 31.03.2019. The above figure also contains the claims for deployment of Police during IPL Matches, which as per tripartite agreement between BCCI, PCA and Franchisee, belongs to IPL Franchisee. The IPL franchisee is directly taking up the matter with Police department. The PCA on its part are contesting the claims, as those are not payable in terms of Police Rules.
- ii.** The Association has received claims from other government departments and other parties for an amount of Rs. 11.92 Lacs (to the extent quantifiable) as on 31st March, 2019. The amounts shown above represents the best possible estimates arrived at on the basis of the available information.

In the opinion of the Association, the above claims against the Association are not sustainable and hence, no liability is required to be booked in the financial statements in this regard.

n) PREVIOUS YEAR FIGURES
